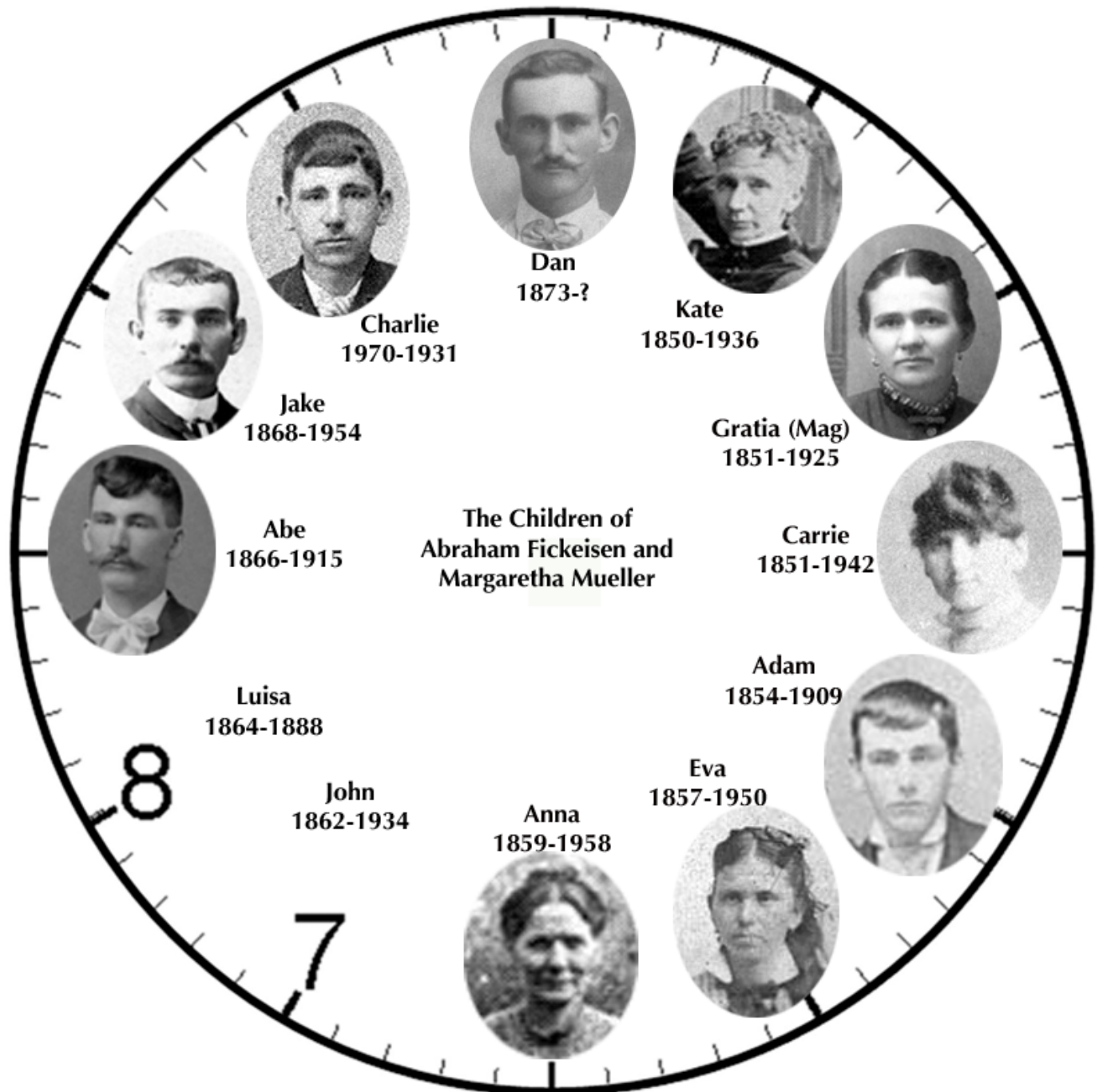

Was on the census for Washington Co., OH, in 1870.⁵ Header cut off. Was on the census for Washington Co., OH - Lawrence Twp., in 1880.⁶ Abraham died on February 19, 1895; he was 69. on Tombstone. Research: **The Ludwig Church Dispute**

One of the documents that Barbara Gearhart Matt translated was the Consitution of the German Protestant Evangelical Church of Lawrence Township (Known as Ludwig Church) and Membership Lists. Upon reading this document, one discovers an incredible and puzzling fact: whoever wrote this document built a scorching feud between families right into it. I have put a [copy of portions of this document online](#), so that readers may draw their own conclusions about this. I think that this dispute is actually significant for understanding these 19th Century German Immigrants. However, it is even more significant for understanding my family history, since it appears that two of my eight great great grandfathers refused to pay certain church fees, and that they and their children were denied entrance into the Ludwig Church.

This much is for sure. Jacob Becker, Adam Buertel, and Abraham Fickeisen "can have no share in the church unless each of them pay \$40.00," unless each of their children pay \$10.00, and unless "they take their part in the church." Nor can they send their children to the school. It is also fairly certain that Abraham's brother, Jacob, was fully behind this action, since he signed the original document along with 16 other close neighbors of the men in question.

Incidentally, this event still lives in my mother's tales of her grandmother (Abraham Fickeisen's daughter, Eva, b. 1857). She said that her father hardly had two quarters to rub together, let alone \$40 and \$10 for each of the 12 children. He just couldn't come up with the money. Mom also remembers that Eva's younger sister (Anna, b. 1859), who lived to be just days short of 100 years old, cleaned the Ludwig graveyard well into the Twentieth Century, even in her sixties and seventies.

In order to better understand this dispute, I have included a partial map of Fearing and Lawrence Townships below. Shown on the map are 1) the disbarred farmers in red, 2) several of the signing farmers in blue, and the two churches, Berg and Ludwig, circled in green. The maps are taken from the

1875 Atlas of Washington County, Ohio available from Selby Publishing of Kokomo, IN.

Story: **How Abraham Educated His Children**

There is some evidence that Abraham Fickeisen felt that he was being penalized by the Church School for requiring that he pay for his many children's education. Whatever the facts are there, we are not sure, but daughter Eva did tell this story. After dinner during the week, he used to set the children round the fireplace, boys on one side and girls on the other, and they would have to take turns reading passages from the Bible.

Story: **Abraham's Fate**

Abraham read the German Bible a lot, and told people when He thought they were wrong. After his daughter, Eva, had been married and gone from the home a few years, his wife, Margaret locked him in a room. When she came to his funeral in 1895, Eva found out about all this. Her younger brother, Dan, took her to the room and showed her the hatched marks where Abraham had tried to get out. Dan also said that while Abraham was crazy, he did say things that were true and make accurate predictions. While he sat by the fireplace, for example, he'd say, "You're going to see carriages without horses, and you'll even see carriages without wings in the air."

Abraham married **Margaretha Müller**. Born on May 7, 1825 in Buborn, Germany. Margaretha died on April 25, 1902; she was 76.

Story: **Dinner on the Table and a New Baby in the Crib**

a story told by Eva Fickeisen Noe about her mother, Margaretha Mueller, to her grand daughter, Lorene Sullivan Andris

"When I was a girl, all the children (Margaretha had six girls and six boys in all) who were at home used to work in the field during harvest time. One hot day in late summer, it was early in the afternoon, and my mother came quietly to me and said, 'I'm going back to the house for a while. You watch over everyone and be sure that they get home in time for supper.' I didn't think much about it, and did as she told me. When we all got back to the house that evening, mother was in the kitchen finishing up dinner and there was a new baby in the crib."

How They Came To America

This is a story told by Margaret Mueller to her daughter, Eva Fickeisen Noe, and retold to her granddaughter, my mother, Lorene Andris.

Abraham Fickeisen met Margaret Mueller, who came to Bonn to work or to attend school to learn mid-wifery. They lived just across the river from each other. [It was the River Glan, I learned from my travels.] They fell in love and saved their money to come to America because the Prussian draft started at 18 years of age and young men had to spend seven years in the army, married or not. There was no exemptions. They were married when they were young, and they ran off to a port, possibly Amsterdam.

They boarded a ship to America about 10 days later. The old sea captain said that the ships were being searched for escapees from the draft. He advised that Abraham not come aboard the ship until way after the patrol quit working around midnight. So Abraham climbed up into a big tree, and sat there, way up in the crotch of the tree, until the wee hours of the morning. He later told Margaret, who had already gotten on the boat, that he was up there listening to the gendarmes reading off the names of the people they were looking for, and he heard his name "spied off." After the coast was clear (he heard the gendarmes say that they were going home for the night), he shinnied down the tree and got on the ship. That morning the wind was just right, so they set their sails and started out just before daylight.

They sailed for 48 days on the Atlantic ocean. Margaret had sewn what money they had in the hem of her petticoat. They had a sea trunk that Abraham had built, which held all of her knitting and midwifery equipment. The trunk also contained woodworking tools and a little clothing. They kept the trunk locked. Mom has the original trunk. They took turns; when she slept, he watched, and vice versa. "They were in steerage with the low-lives and the cattle." They were allowed to come up from steerage

once or twice a day for sunshine. Whenever people died, they were immediately thrown overboard. They woke up one morning and the wind had blown them back as far as they'd come the day before.

According to my mother, they arrived here around July 4, 1843, although as we shall see, there is some reason to question this date. This was before Ellis Island. They didn't know about our 4th of July celebration; the Captain had to explain. They were really scared at first, because in the early years of our country there was lots of gunfire. There was a German farmer down at the dock who asked them if they wanted work. He gave them a cabin to live in Albany, NY. He helped them with their language. Grandma Mueller was very, very smart. She schooled herself to speak English. They got their citizenship papers. They had to go down to the capital there and they asked them certain questions.

What the census data tells us about Abraham Fickeisen and Margaretha Mueller

Raising their family. Over a period of twenty years, Abraham and Margaret had 12 children, 6 boys and 6 girls. According to the census data, the dates of the original 12 children are:

It's not quite as certain where the children were born. One probable path, according to my mom, was **New York City -> Albany -> Syracuse -> Erie -> Ashtabula -> Wheeling -> Pleasant Ridge (Lawrence Twp.), Ohio**. My most probable estimate is that the first four children were born in Syracuse, NY, Eve was born in Wheeling, (West) Virginia, and the rest were born on Pleasant Ridge in Washington County, Ohio.

I think that the census data in Table 1 is consistent with what my mom believes. Notice that the reported birthplace of the middle children Adam, Eve, and Anna, changes for the three censuses. I tend to believe the 1870 Census for the following reasons. The 1860 Census had mostly the first six children (although Eve inexplicably isn't mentioned), and they probably just said that they had come from New York. However, why Catherine, the first child, is shown as being born in Ohio in the 1860 Census is a mystery. At the time of the 1880 Census, only Adam remained of the children born in New York. So they may have just said that all the children were born in Ohio. However, at the time of the 1870 Census, there was the greatest mix of children born in the three locations New York, Virginia and Ohio. If we trust the 1870 Census, it shows that the first four children were born in New York. Eve is shown as being born in Virginia in the 1870 census, but remember that West Virginia was then part of Virginia. All of the other children are shown as being born in Ohio.

Bringing in the land records

So the Fickeisen family got to Pleasant Ridge some time after 1857. According to my mom, there was a law, the Homestead Act, in Ohio where if you bought 100 acres of land and cleared it, you could get the first acre for \$100, then you could buy \$1 an acre to add to your farm. You had to put a cabin house on first acre. This had been the Northwest Territory. Abraham Fickeisen, Eva's father, had 75 acres and 40 acres. He cleared the original 75 acres, bought the 40 acres for Abraham Jr (Eva's brother). It's not clear to me why he singled out this particular son in this way.

My curiosity drove me to the Recorder of Deeds in the Washington County Court House. There I found detailed information that both augments and alters my mother's story. According to these records on April 13, 1857 Abraham Fickerson (sic) of the county of Ohio, state of Virginia agreed to pay John and Anna Block \$360 in cash for the "old home place" which is described as follows: "The Northwest quarter of the N.E. quarter of section 30, Town 3, Range 7 of Lawrence Township containing 37.68 acres more or less." The deed goes on to record that on October 1, 1857, the Blocks appeared before a justice of the peace and certified that they were still satisfied with this deal. This property lies surrounding the intersection of Washington Co. Rt. 42 and Lawrence Twp. Rt. T378. On August 30, 1865, Abraham Fickisen purchased another 40 acres for \$500 immediately west of the original farm from Henry Weirs and wife.

It thus became clear that Abraham had not bought the land under the Homestead Act, as my mother had remembered. Rather, what probably happened is this. My great grandmother, Eve Fickeisen, was born in March of 1857 in Wheeling. When the weather warmed up a bit early that spring in April, Abraham went to Marietta, Ohio, probably by boat. He had saved money and bought the original "40 acres" from John and Anna Block. Whether he went first by himself, or whether he took his family of five children of ages 7, 6, 4, 2 and my newly born great grandmother along with him we do not know. It certainly is wonderfully exciting to think of the adventurous spirit that took these people down the Ohio River that spring of 1857. I have made a map that shows [the location of Abraham's original purchases](#). The dot at the intersection of 42 and T378 represents both the 1857 and the 1865 acquisition. By the time Abraham bought the second "40 acres," his family had grown to seven or eight (Abraham, Jr. may have been on the way).

The Canning Table

We were upstairs with Vicki looking at the steerage trunk that Abraham Fickeisen made to bring their stuff over on the sailing ship. Mom said that the knitting equipment that was kept in there, the knitting needles were made of bone, and that in the winter they knitted all the socks and other things that they needed for the year. Then we asked her who made the drop leaf table. She said, "Grandma told me a story about that. She said that her mother and she were in the kitchen making jelly and Mutter said, "I need another table." Fatter overheard this, and didn't say a word, just went out and bought this table

from a neighbor for a quarter."

An old German cradle poem:

Bache, bache ku-ha. Die Becker hat geruven.

Wer would gude Kuchen haben,

Der would haben sieben saven:

Butter und smaltch, eier und salz, milch und Maehl,

Und saffron mach die Kuchen Gael.

Translation:

Bake, bake a cake, the baker says.

If you want a good cake,

You need seven ingredients:

Butter and [chicken] fat, eggs and salt, milk and flour

And saffron makes the cake yellow.

2. Katharina Fickeisen. Born in 1850 in Syracuse, NY. Was on the census for Washington Co., OH - Lawrence Twp., in 1860.⁴ oldest daughter (10). Was on the census for Parkersburg, WV, in 1880.⁷ 30 years old. Katharina died in Lubeck, WV, in 1936; she was 86.

Katherine Miller Obituary

"Mrs. Katherine Miller, 86 years old, wife of Charles Miller, died Saturday evening at her home in Lubeck. Surviving in addition to the husband are three children, Mrs. Carrie Wylie, of Columbus, O. Andrew Miller of Lubeck, and Adam, at home; two grandchildren, Farrow Wylie, of Columbus, and Nina Fay Miller of Lubeck; three sisters, Mrs. Eva Noe of Marietta, O., Mrs. Anna Biehl, Stanleyville, O., and Mrs. Caroline Scheffler, of Galion, O., and three brothers, J. Fickeisen, Dan Fickeisen and Charlie Fickeisen, of Ohio. Funeral services will take place Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Carney funeral home, Eighth and Ann streets."⁸

Research: From Eleanor Scott email Nov. 19, 2007

"Katherine Fickeisen Miller's son Adam never married. He's buried at Lubeck Cemetery. Andrew Miller married Amy Gaye Haislip on 29 August 1918. He's buried at Bethel Cemetery (probably Bethel Baptist Cemetery) in Wood County. Andrew had a daughter, Nina Faye. She married Merritt Blaine Morrison (a divorced man) on 20 August 1960. She married late in life at 40 years of age."⁹



Charles

Katharina married **Charles Miller.** Born in 1848 in Germany.⁷

Family settled in Lubeck, WV. They had two boys, Andy and another one. Andy had no kids, never married. 2nd boy had a small farm, had a boy and girl.¹⁰

3. Margaretha Fickeisen. Born on March 16, 1851 in Syracuse, NY. Was on the census for Washington Co., OH - Lawrence Twp., in 1860.⁴ Confirmed in 1865 in Lutheran Church, Sitka, Ohio. Was on the census for Washington Co., OH, in 1870.⁵ with parents as housekeeper. Margaretha died in Sitka, Ohio, in 1925; she was 73.¹⁰ Tombstone.

Nickname: Gratia. "The old home was on Rte. 26 just at Sitka."¹⁰

Research: **Mrs. Jacob Becker Claimed by Death**

Mrs. Margaret Becker, aged 74 years, wife of Jacob K. Becker, of Sitka, died at her home on Friday evening at 7 o'clock. Death was due to complications. She had been in declining health for several months. She was seriously ill for only a week.

Mrs. Becker was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Abraham Fickeisen, of Fearing township. She was born in Syracuse, NY, on March 16, 1851, and when a child came with her parents to Washington County. On January 14, 1875, she was united in marriage with Jacob K. Becker, and for the past fifty years the couple has made their home on the farm where she died. Since the age of 14 years, she had been a member of the German Lutheran church at Sitka.

Besides her husband, Mrs. Becker is survived by a son, John Edward Becker, who lives at the Becker homestead. Three grand-children, the son and daughters of Jacob D. Becker, who died four years ago, are Elmer Becker, and Misses Wanda and Oma Becker of Reno. Four brothers and four sisters also survive. They are Charles Fickeisen and John Fickeisen, of Whipple; Jacob Fickeisen and Mrs. Eva Noe, of Marietta; Daniel Fickeisen and Mrs. Anna Biehl, of Pleasant Ridge; Mrs. Catherine Miller, of Lubeck, WV; and Mrs. Carrie Scheffler of Gallion.

Funeral services will be held at Sitka on Monday morning at 10:30 o'clock. Interment will be made in the churchyard.¹¹

Story: **Grandniece Lorene Sullivan Andris Stories about "Gratia" Fickeisen**

"Aunt Mag" was her mother Margaretha's favorite daughter. She was kicked in the head by a cow on their farm in her adult years. By the time my mother knew her, her mind had been affected, and the damage progressed as she got older."

On January 14, 1875 when Margaretha was 23, she married **Jacob K. Becker**, son of Daniel Becker &

Margaret Kline.¹² Thursday. Born on November 15, 1848 in Lawrence Twp., Washington Co., Oh. Jacob K. died in Sitka, Ohio, on September 28, 1936; he was 87.¹⁰ Tombstone.

They had the following children:

4. Carolina Fickeisen. Born on August 16, 1851 in NY (Connecticut).¹³ Was on the census for Washington Co., OH - Lawrence Twp., in 1860.⁴ Carolina died in Galion, Ohio, on June 29, 1942; she was 90.¹³

Story: **Grandniece Lorene Sullivan Andris Stories about "Carrie" Fickeisen**

"Eva (sister of Carolina) did not get along with Carrie. Carrie told a lie that Eva had stolen her necklace. Later on, the necklace was found down in the chimney."

"When I was a child of seven or eight, one day a well-dressed woman and man in a fine horse-drawn carriage drove up to the very modest dwelling where mom and I were living. The woman identified herself as sister, Carrie, and asked to see Eva. Mother ran upstairs to relay the message to grandma Eva, who replied "Tell her I don't want to see her." And they turned around and drove away." Later my mom remarked that perhaps Eva didn't want her sister to see the stark poverty in which they were living.

Research: On Nov. 18, 2003, I drove up to Galion, Ohio. With the help of Debra Jeffers, Outreach and Genealogy Coordinator at the Galion Public Library, I was able to find Carrie's obituary, her funeral notice, and finally, her unmarked grave. However, as happens so often in genealogical research, solving one mystery throws up more puzzles.

I believe that her obituary in the Galion Inquirer, June 30, 1942 almost certainly establishes that a Carrie Scheffler, age 90 at the time, is none other than the Caroline Fickeisen, third daughter of Abraham and Margaret Fickeisen.

The obituary makes two statements that do not fit. First, it states that she "was born in Connecticut, New York, August 16, 1851, daughter of Jacob and Sarah Fickeisen [*italics mine.*]" The date given could be right, but it is unrealistically close to the March, 1851 birthdate given for sister, Margaretha. The given names of the parents are not correct. Furthermore, the obituary states that "she lived in Galion until about three and a half years ago." My hunch is that these were actually fabrications that grew out of an alienated family situation. We will need to continue this discussion when we get to a younger brother, Abraham Fickeisen, who very likely migrated from Washington County to Galion to

follow his sister, Carrie.

As far as her life in Galion, the obituary tells us quite a bit. "She was united in marriage ... January 19, 1882 to Adam Scheffler who preceded her in death December 16, 1932. She is survived by two sons, A. L. Scheffler, at home, and H. L. Scheffler of this city. There are four grandchildren and two great grandchildren." Another son and daughter preceded her in death.

The funeral notice [July 3 in the Galion Inquirer] is also full of interesting information. Four of the pallbearers were her two sons, Howard and A. L., and probably two grandsons, Edward and Robert. Another pallbearer was Elmer Biehl, whom I know is the son of her sister, Anna Fickeisen Biehl. The last pallbearer, Harold Boyce. Also present were Elmer Biehl's wife (Marie, who was German) and Mrs. Cleora Zweisler, of Toledo, probable daughter of ¹³Carrie's younger brother, Abraham.

Research: From Eleanor Scott, email Nov 18, 2007

"1900: Adam and Carrie were living in Galion, Crawford with their two sons, listed as Leonard and Lawrence. These were middle names of the boys who lived.

1910: Adam, Carrie, Adam L. and Henry L. are still living in Galion.

1920: Adam is a lodger claiming to be a widower. He's living in Galion.

1920: Carrie is living at a separate residence but still in Galion. She doesn't mind admitting that she's divorced.

1930: Adam is staying with his son Henry in Galion. Two years later he will die.

1930: Carrie is still living in Galion, alone.

According to the "Ohio Deaths" Adam died in Franklin on 14 December 1932.

According to "Ohio Deaths" Carrie died 29 June 1942 in Richland County which is a neighboring county to Franklin where Adam died. On son Adam Leonard Scheffler's WWII Draft notice he lists his mother, his wife and one child as dependents. So the statement that she "lived in Galion until about 3 1/2 years ago may very well be correct."

Story: I found Carrie's unmarked grave in the Gallion, Ohio, Fairview Cemetary, section 9, lot 220. Grave is marked by the very small stone on the left, which has only the number "220" on it. Her husband's grave is three spaces to the right and marked by a headstone. The dates on Adam Scheffler's stone are 1857-1932. I stood there with my head bowed, and tried to think of an appropriate prayer. Finally I said to her, "Well, Carrie, I found you in an unmarked grave after 60 years. I pray that you are at peace, and that now all is forgiven."¹⁴

On January 19, 1882 when Carolina was 30, she married **J. Adam Scheffler**^{13,15}.¹³ Thursday. Born in 1857.¹⁶ J. Adam died on December 16, 1932; he was 75.¹³

They had the following children:

- 20 ii. Howard L. Scheffler

5. Adam Fickeisen. Born on September 9, 1854 in Syracuse, NY. Was on the census for Washington Co., OH - Lawrence Twp., in 1860.⁴ with parents as laborer. Was on the census for Washington Co., OH, in 1870.⁵ age 15, works on farm. Was on the census for Washington Co, OH, in 1880.⁶ age 26, son, laborer. Adam died in Lubeck, WV, in 1909; he was 54.¹⁷ Buried in Lubeck, WV.¹⁷



Adam

Adam Fickeisen is another somewhat mysterious child of Abraham and Margaretha. He worked on the home farm until his late twenties, and then may have entered a somewhat arranged marriage (Adam and Eve Fickeisen, sister and brother, married Carolina and Ludwig Noe, sister and brother, within a period of a month, both fathers, Abraham and Andreas attending—indeed, four of Abraham's children married in 1882). After Adam's marriage, only child, Ida, was born the next year in October. He is buried in Lubeck, WV, but we do not know how or where he spent the next 25 years until his death.



Carolina "Dammie"

On December 28, 1882 when Adam was 28, he married **Carolina "Dammie" Noe**, daughter of Andreas Noe & Carolina Harth, in Fearing Twp.^{18,19} Thursday, Daniel Hirsch, pastor. Marriage witnessed by their fathers. Born on December 13, 1863 in Fearing Twp. (Near Whipple).²⁰ Carolina "Dammie" died in Washington Bottom, WV, on March 25, 1941; she was 77.²⁰

Obituary

Funeral Services for Mrs. Caroline Noe Fickeisen, 77, former resident of Washington County who died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Phillip Moellendick, at Washington Bottom, W. Va., on Tuesday, will be held at the Moellendick home on Friday at 2 p.m. Interment will be in Lubeck cemetery. Marietta relatives will attend the funeral.

Mrs Fickeisen was a daughter of the late Andrew and Caroline Noe. She was born near Whipple and spent her early life there. She had lived in Wood County, W. Va. for many years.²⁰

According to Arthur Moellendick, her grandnephew, she did not go to live with her daughter at Lubeck, WV, until after husband, Adam's death.

Story: **Grandniece Lorene Andris Stories about "Dammie" Noe**

According to Lorene Andris, there were lots of stories about Adam's wife, "Dammie" Noe. 1) Supposedly she got this name because her child called her this. 2) One time Grandma Noe (Eva) made herself a nice dress out of some red material. Supposedly, Dammie made a dress out of the same material for a woman of loose character in their church, and this made Eva mad. 3) When Dammie was on her deathbed, she asked for forgiveness for the things she had done to Eva. Eva is said to have said, "I forgive her, but I don't want to see her."¹⁰

Weigand, Pastor. Was on the census for Lawrence Twp. Wash. Co., OH, in 1880. with parents, age 23. Eva died in Marietta, OH, USA, on April 21, 1950; she was 93. stomach hemorrhage.

Story: **Eva's First Love.** Eva was dating Jacob Biehl (b. 22 Feb 1857), and she had said "I loved him and he loved me, but his folks thought the Fickeisens were not high class enough." The couple had a little code they used to signal that they were to meet in their secret meeting place. On one date they had, it began to rain. He caught pneumonia and became gravely ill. He called for Eva on his death bed, but his parents didn't call her. She found out that he was dead after it happened. She pined for a year, then realized that she had to go on.¹⁰

Story: **Were the twins born in wedlock?** "People tried to say that Ella was born out of wedlock. But I just went and got the marriage certificate, which mom [Clara Sullivan] had with her jewelry. I gave it to Aunt Ella, and she said 'That makes me feel good, Lorene.'" "It was Carolina 'Dammie' Noe Fickeisen who tried to spread this and other vicious rumors about Eve. When Dammie was on her death bed, she asked for Eve's forgiveness through Ella. Eve said she forgave her, but she didn't want anything to do with her 'after the terrible things she did to me.'"¹⁰

Story: **Life with Lou Noe on the farm.** When Eva married him, Louis Noe (probably Ludwig) had a wagon, a cookstove, a bedstead, a table and two or three chairs. Later they bought a rocker. Father Andrew Noe bought grandma a nice sewing machine for \$25 as a gift. The log cabin where they lived in Wood County, WV had a ladder for stairs, no floor. The log cabin was not even sealed. Eva was shocked when they arrived at the farm, because she had been lead to believe things were a bit better. Eva set her bags down and made him agree to build the floor and add rooms, or she would turn

around and go back to Pleasant Ridge. They had to chink up the logs before the winter. They papered one room with wallpaper, the other rooms with newspaper. They put in a grape arbor the next summer, got chickens, cow and horses. Lou and Eva's daughter, Clara, said he was so mean she had to hitch the horses. Eva later supposedly told Clara, "If they'd have had such a thing as divorce in those days, when I saw that shack he called a house, I'd have got one."¹⁰

Story: **How Lou Noe died.** Lou Noe had a terrible temper and also had occasional temper tantrums. One time he threw a singletree at his youngest daughter in a fit of rage and nearly hit her. One day when he was 45 Lou didn't come in for supper. They went out looking for him and found him bent over dead in the hog trough. Apparently he had a heart attack or stroke.

Story: **Back to Pleasant Ridge.** When Eva came back from W.Va., She was 47 and this was 1904. She took their earnings from the Hopewell farm—she got \$1200 for whole thing—and with daughter Clara, moved back to the old homestead. Both her parents had died, so she and brother, Charlie assumed the ownership of the old homestead, the rest of the children signing wavers (except possibly for sister, Kate). Eva and Clara lived on the old home place until 1909. (The old homestead consisted of 76 acres plus 40 acres; see map in 6.)

Story: **The Move to Marietta**

Some time around 1910, Eva and Clara moved to Marietta. Clara worked at the Cigar factory. Eva worked for Pape's grocery store on Greene St. and was a combination housewife, nanny and store clerk. They may have stayed for a time at 103 Oakwood Ave. with another Eva Noe, who was 1st cousin to Eva's deceased husband.

Story: **What became of the old Homestead.** Abraham had originally bought 76 acres in northern Lawrence Twp. and then another 40 acres in Liberty Twp. Apparently there were oil royalties that paid for the property taxes which ran out at some point. Brother, Charlie had paid the taxes for the family after that. In 1934, Charlie arranged a deal for Doc Johnson to buy the original 76 acres as a retirement home.²¹ The deal was settled, but not without Eva's reservations about Charlie's honesty in the matter. Eva, Charlie and Kate then ended up as owners of the last 40 acres in Liberty Twp.

Story: **What became of the 40 acres?** In 1925, the 40 acres went to joint ownership by Harmon Fickeisen, who was the son of Charlie Fickeisen, Wanda Hill, who was related through grandma's sister, Margaret Fickeisen Becker, and Eva Noe, my great grandmother. Charlie's son Harmon and Wanda, a granddaughter of Kate, never would pay the taxes. Lorene (my mother) paid the taxes for 20 years. Lorene and her husband, Fernand, decided to sell the property. She sold the coal rights for \$12000, a strip 3 feet wide and 9 feet deep full length of 40 acres. She sold the whole property for \$12000. This was split three ways with Harmon and Wanda (\$8000) They never said thank you. She could have showed that she paid the taxes, but didn't. She said, "I'm not going to be greedy. There's

been so much thieving and cheating since 1872, that I'm going to put an end to it right now." She felt that she had the sanction of the lord to do it. "The only one who came and thank me was Clifton Hill (Wanda's husband), and he was only an inlaw. He stepped back and said 'that was awful nice of you to do that for us, we needed the money.'" Lorene said "That's alright." Clifton said, "You know you could have just took the money." She said, "I know." Then he shook her hand.

On November 21, 1882 when Eva was 25, she married **Ludwig "Lou" Noe**, son of Andreas Noe & Carolina Harth, in Tuesday.²² Born on June 28, 1859 in Fearing Twp. Ludwig "Lou" died in Wood Co., WV, in 1904; he was 44.

7. Anna Maria Philippina Fickeisen. Born on August 26, 1859 in Lawrence Twp., Washington Co., Oh.^{23,18} Was on the census for Washington Co., OH - Lawrence Twp., in 1860.⁴ ? Should be Eve. At the age of 1, Anna Maria Philippina was baptized on January 3, 1861. at 12:00 noon. Witnesses were Jacob Fickeisen, Maria Boehrmann wife of Heinrich Weiss, Friedrich Mootz, Katharina Born wife of Adam Buertel, Friedrich Bender, Philippina Lamprecht wife of Jacob Born. Was on the census for Washington Co., OH, in 1870.⁵ 11, in school. Anna Maria Philippina died in Washington Co., on July 6, 1958; she was 98. Buried in Ludwig Cemetery.

Story: The Biehls came from Bonn, intermarried with the Fickeisens and the Noes. They had two boys Elmer and Irvin. Elmer married Marie from Germany and Irvin married Blanch Oliver. Neither son sired children.¹⁰

Story: **Hoedown.** Someone said to "Aunt" Annie, "Let's have a dance." She said "Well, you can't have it in the barn, it's full of hay." So they moved the big dining room table up against the wall. They had four

sets (a set is two couples), most in the big room, some in another room. There were musicians in the Fickeisen clan. Eve played the concertina and Dan played the violin.¹⁰

Story: **Was Anna Biehl abused by her daughter-in-law?** Irvin and Blanch lived with "Aunt Annie," Irvin's mother on the family homestead. The house is on County Road 24 (Moss Run) in Washington County. Apparently Blanch abused Anna. Blanch Oliver had a brother, Clay Oliver. His daughter, Margie verified (Nov 92) that Blanch beat up on Aunt Annie. (Dale Moore married Margie.) Margie's mother saw the bruises on Anna's back. Elmer (lived out of town) wanted Lorene, to call the sheriff. Lorene, said "Wait a minute, Elmer, you're the son, I'm only the grand niece." Elmer packed up his bags and went back to Florida.¹⁰

Story: **How Irvin died.** Later on, Irvin was in hospital for two months. He was a lineman for the County and had gotten electrocuted, fallen and broken his leg, which was then put in traction. While he was gone, Blanch put Anna in the County House. When he came back from the hospital, he sat down at the supper table and said, "Blanche, where's mother?" Blanch said, "She's in the County House where she belongs. I can't take care of both you and her." Irvin looked down at his plate and keeled over dead. (Neighbor woman, Taylor, told this story.) Blanch also sold the old family tree that hung on the wall to a beer hall.¹⁰

On September 21, 1882 when Anna Maria Philippina was 23, she married **Heinrich (Henry) Biehl**, son of Ludwig (Louis) Ten Biehl & Catharina Schultheiss, in Fearing Twp., Washington Co., OH.²⁴ 2 pm Witnesses: Dorothea Hirsch and Philippina, wife of Daniel Hirsch. Born on June 26, 1860 in Lawrence Twp., Washington Co., Oh. Heinrich (Henry) died in 1926; he was 65.²⁵ obit May 6.

Story: John Fickeisen was a carpenter who settled in Whipple with his family. He may have passed his trade on, in various degrees, to three of his younger brothers. Jacob, who was six years younger, lived in Marietta and built and fixed houses there. Charlie, nine years younger, settled in Whipple near John. And we do have examples of the furniture building of youngest brother, Dan. He was known to our family as Uncle John Fickeisen.¹⁰

Johann Eduard married **Elizabetha Eva Noe**, daughter of Heinrich Jacob Noe & Luisa Schultheiss. Born on January 21, 1867 in Fearing Twp. Elizabetha Eva died in 1936; she was 68.²⁷

1936. Mrs. Elisabeth Fickeisen, aged 65 years, wife of John E. Fickeisen, died at the family home at Whipple on Wednesday at 5:10 a. m. following an extended illness with heart trouble. Mrs. Fickeisen was a daughter of the late Henry and Louise Schultheis Noe. She was born on January 21, 1867, in Fearing Township, where she spent practically her entire life. She was a member of the Lutheran Church. Surviving the deceased are her husband and six sons and daughters, Clarence Fickeisen of Akron; Mrs. Edward Gerber of Stanleyville; Mrs. Frank Keller of Lowell; Mrs Florence Stann of Marietta; Mrs. Lorena Fosnight and Mrs. Nettie Doan at the family home. There are two brothers and a sister, William Noe of Parkersburg; Adolph Noe of Kent, and Miss Clara Noe of Akron. Funeral servicers will be held at the Universalist Church at Salem Township and interment will be made in the cemetery nearby.²⁷

9. Luisa Fickeisen. Born on April 18, 1864 in Lawrence Twp., Washington Co., Oh.²⁸ Was on the census for Washington Co., OH, in 1870.⁵ 6 years old. Was on the census for Lawrence Twp., Washington Co., Oh, in 1880.⁶ 16 years old. Luisa died in Ludwig Cemetery, on January 10, 1888; she

was 23.²⁸

Research: There is some question about the spelling of "Luisa." I have seen it spelled "Louisa." The spelling on her tombstone is "Luwisa."²⁸ There is also the question, if she was married to a Biehl, why is that name not listed on her tombstone? Luisa is something of a mystery—short life, no picture, no stories about her.

Luisa married **Biehl**²⁹.

10. Abraham Fickeisen. Born on June 27, 1866 in Lawrence Twp., Washington Co., Oh.³⁰ Was on the census for Washington Co., OH, in 1870.⁵ 4 years old. Was on the census for Washington Co, OH, in 1880.⁶ 13 years old. Abraham died in Toledo, Ohio, on March 2, 1915; he was 48.³¹

Story: **Lorene Andris' memories.** Abraham, Jr. was married. Abraham, Sr. bought the 40 acres for Abe, Jr. and his wife. (See map in 6.) They had two kids and lived with Abraham, Sr. Then Abe, Jr.'s wife left. Eva Noe said she ran off with another man. Cleora was their child, and she lived in Chicago. Cleora married a Zweisler and played the piano. She came to visit us when I was 11 and played the Petite Waltz. Abe, Jr. and his wife also had a boy; he may have died of TB. Cleora Zweisler had one boy, who lives in Chicago and was married late in life.¹⁰

Story: **What happened to Abe Fickeisen, Jr.?**

Lorene Andris' story, above, is told from the point of view of the family and descendants of the Fickeisens who remained on Pleasant Ridge. Abe married had two kids, then his wife left and he died of heartbreak. Abe, Jr. was Abe, Sr.'s namesake, his father had bought 40 acres just for him, but somehow, this all turned sour.

Documents from Galion, Ohio paint a tragic end to this story. No ties to Pleasant Ridge origins are mentioned; those ties were cut. A likely scenario is that Abe and Katie and their two children, Cleora and Arthur, ended up in Galion, where Abe's sister, Carrie Fickeisen Scheffler had already taken up residence. Abe, Jr. became more and more mentally ill and ended up in the Ohio State mental hospital years before his death in his late forties. By that time, son, Arthur Benjamn, had also died,³² leaving widow, Katie, and daughter, Cleora. Katie had joined the United Church of Christ in 1910, possibly after Abe's confinement, and daughter Katie was confirmed in that church shortly after Abe's Death.

Obituary from Galion Inquirer: Fickeisen Passed Away: Galion Man Died in Toledo State Hospital.

Abe Fickeisen died in the hospital at Toledo, last night. He had been at the institution for some time, his case being incurable. He was 45 years of age and had been a resident of Galion all his life. The

remains will arrive here this evening, and the funeral will be conducted by Rev. Ruf, in the First Reformed church, at 2 o'clock, Friday afternoon. The deceased leaves his widow and two children, one child having preceded him to eternity.³³

Obituary from Galion Daily Leader: Death of Galion Man in Toledo Hospital.

Frank Fickeisen died Monday evening at the Toledo State Hospital after a protracted illness. The body will be brought to the home on First Avenue in this city some time tonight and funeral services will be held from the First Reformed Church Friday afternoon at 1:30, conducted by the Rev. Ruf. Burial will be made in Fairview.³⁴

May be buried in Fairview Cemetery Gallion, OH cemetery, dates 27 Jun 1866 to 2 Mar 1915. Married to Catharine Schupple. May have two sons buried there. Arthur Benjamin, died at 14 years, Harvey, died at 17 yrs.³⁰

Mrs. Katie Fickeisen, wife of Jacob Fickeisen (could have been Abe's other name), was received by the church on June 26, 1910. Furthermore, she took communion at Pentecost in 1915. It is noted that her husband is deceased at this point. Finally, the records state that a Cleora Maud Fickeisen was confirmed May 23, 1915.³⁵

Story: **The Recollections of Lorene Andris.** Clearly, Jacob and Mary Noe Fickeisen were very important people for a time in the lives of Clara Noe Sullivan and her daughter Lorene Sullivan Andris. Here are notes made in conversations with her in 1999.

Jacob Fickeisen lived on Woodlawn in Marietta, OH, 2nd house from corner on the right as you go from Phillips to Kenwood. "Uncle Jake" had built this house. He was in fact a carpenter who built houses all around Norwood. After Frank Sullivan died in 1921, Lorene, Clara, and Clara's mother Eva Fickeisen Noe lived with them for a little less than a year in the back of their house on Woodlawn. There was a kitchen downstairs, a bedroom upstairs, and no stool or running water. Jake bought Lorene her first "sleepy doll" for Christmas. Mary was very pretty and always had lace around her neck. She had had operations and was peculiar and would lie around a lot. When Jake would come home from work, she'd say, "Oh, Sheck, Jake, let's go jump in the creek!" She made Lorene sleep out on the porch in the cold weather. Lorene caught a cold, and this caused the women to move. Mary had a brother Jacob and a sister, Phoebe, who married a Schramm.

He moved to Marietta some time after he and Mary got married. He worked in a brick yard until his foot got cut off. Consequently he had to have a wooden foot. He then became a carpenter; brother John taught him. He built 23 houses in Norwood decorated with a lot of "gingerbread," which he cut out himself.¹⁰

He also did carpentry and worked in the oil fields.¹⁰

Story: **Lorene Andris Memories**

Charles Fickeisen lived a full life, and his grandniece, Lorene Andris, had quite a few memories about him. Some of them are not favorable. Under his sister, Eva's section, the story has been told of his joint ownership of the "40 Acres" with Eva and the descendants of sister Margaretha Fickeisen Becker. Eva felt she had been cheated and rooked by him on more than one occasion. The other story was that he nearly died from a venereal infection he got from a prostitue.

That being said, it's clear that Charlie was an interesting person. He didn't just live life on a farm. He did play cornet in the Cow Run Band with his son playing horn. He found some oil on the 40 acres and drilled a well or two. He "had the biggest house in Whipple." It also seems clear that being the next-to-youngest son in a family of twelve, he was often the "go to" person when problems arose. He certainly lended support to his younger brother Dan, who had a hard life.

Obituary: Charles Fickeisen of Whipple Dies

Charles Fickeisen, aged 66 years, life long resident of Washington County, died at his home at Whipple on Friday at 6:15 a.m., following illness of two years. Funderal services will be held at the home on Sunday at 2 p.m. and interment will be made in the Universalist Cemetery in Salem Township. The body will remain at Doudna and McClure parlors until Saturday.

Mr. Fickeisen was born on Pleasant Ridge on November 12, 1870, and was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Abraham Fickeisen, who were natives of Germany. He was united in marriage with Rosena Gilcher 45 years ago and she survives with three sons and a daughter, Freeman Fickeisen of the family home at Whipple; Forman Fickeisen of Whipple; Harmon Fickeisen of Ackron and Mrs. J. M. Farson of Marietta. A daughter, Mrs. Norma Fickeisen Erb, died a few years ago. A son died in infancy. There are eight grandchildren.

Brothers and sisters of Mr. Fickeisen are Jacob Fickeisen and Mrs. Eva Noe of Marietta; Daniel Fickeisen and Mrs. Annie Biehl of Pleasant Ridge, and Mrs. Carrie Scheffler of Gallion. Mr. Fickeisen had been engaged as a a carpenter and had also worked in the oil fields of Washington County. He was confirmed in the Ludwig Lutheran Church when young. He was one of the early members of

Whipple Grange and had held office in the grange.

On December 24, 1892 when Charles was 22, he married **Rosena Gilcher**, daughter of Frederick Gilcher & Caroline Elizabetha Zimmer, in Washington Co., OH.³⁹ Born on April 5, 1872 in Caywood, Marietta, Oh.⁴⁰ Rosena died in Whipple on June 25, 1955; she was 83.⁴⁰

Dan played the stringed instruments, said that he "wasn't windy like some of his siblings," meaning he didn't play a wind instrument. He married Margaret Burriss. Mom had his marriage certificate, which is dated November 4, 1908 and signed by N.E. Kidd, J.P. My mother says he built cabinets for lots of folks out on Pleasant Ridge. I have a coat tree made by him.

According to Lorene Andris, Old Nell Weinstock (used to play the piano down at the Eagles Lodge) found Lula almost starved to death, because Mildred left with some guy when Uncle Dan was on a trip. In the summer Dan came down there and wanted Clara, the daughter of his older sister, Eva, to take Lula and raise her. Frank, Clara's husband, had a violent reaction to this request. Clara was pregnant with Lorene at the time. Eva said, "Why don't you go out to [sister] Annie? she doesn't have a family." Annie and Henry [Biehl] took both Dan and Lula in and they stayed there until 1940, when

Blanch and Irvin Biehl [their son] came back. They kicked Dan out and he lived in an abandoned school house. Lorene took food out to Dan even when her son, Tommy was a baby. [1946] Finally, Lula went to the welfare and they found Dan a place to stay a rest home in Whipple. She was adopted. Lula Fickeisen, their daughter, died of drink. She wasn't found for three days. The police found her. She had no children.

Research: **A Possible Daughter Born out of Wedlock**

In February of 2002, I received an email message from Mary Ann Knoke. She had been searching on the internet for information on her grandmother, Lillian Covey. In Mary Ann's own words: "I have reason to believe that Daniel Fickeisen was my grandfather. My grandmother, Lillian {Covey} Baltz, told my mother, Goldie, that she fell in love with a young man named Daniel Fickeisen and when she became pregnant he disappeared."

I uncovered relevant facts that tend to support Mary Ann's assertion. Lillian Baltz and her daughter, Goldie, lived with Lillian's parents, George and Sarah Midkiff Covey on their farm in Marietta, Ohio until Lillian married Ed Baltz. Ed ran a sawmill in Sitka, 12 miles from Marietta, OH. 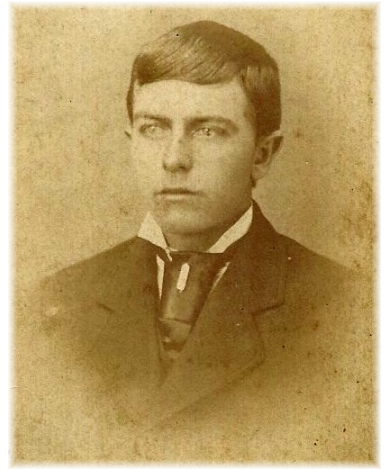
